Records

Last weekend Caltech's Swim Team travelled to Cerritos Olympic Pool for the SCIAC Conference Championship. Although both the men's and women's teams were a lock for fifth place, the Techers swam their way into the record book.

The three day meet started with a bang as the women's 200 yard Freestyle Relay consisting of Karen Ross, Karin Johnson, Jerri Martin, and Monica Holboke shaved five seconds off the school record to post a 1:54.31.

Later that night, Holboke placed a strong 2:25.59 for fourth place in the 200 Individual Medley. In the last event, the 400 yard Medley relay, Vania Lee replaced Johnson and the women set another record dropping eight seconds from the standard set in 1979.

The second day found the men swimming strong as Brian Shim, Korhan Gurkan, and Nick Pornsinsirak all placed in the 100 yard

breaststroke, while Keith thompson, Mark Savellano, and Shim placed in the 400 yard Individual Medley. The 100 yard backstroke found Barry Stipe fighting off a bad start to place fourth with a 57.95 while Thompson swan to a speedy

Diving in his first conference championship Allen Corcorran placed fifth on both the one and three meter. On the distaff side Vania Lee swam past her competition to place high in the 100 yard but-

The distance swimmers were dropping time all during the meet, but it was in the 1650 yard freestyle that they really shined: Dave Geraghty, 17:46.36, Roger Moore, 18:23.18, and Tim Maddux 19:30.78. All had lifetime bests but Moore surprised everyone with more than a two minute better swim to get the day off to a great

That master of musical mischief, P.D.Q. Bach, will make his final final appearance on Monday, April 1, at the Pasadena Civic Auditorium, in concert with the Pasadena Symphony.

For over 25 years Prof. Peter Schickele "of the University of Southern North Dakota at Hoople" has performed and interpreted the works of P.D.Q. Bach, the purported last and/or least son of J. Sebastian Bach-including several appearances on campus in

Beckman Auditorium. (The show's stage manager likened those occasions to "performing inside a wed-

Music Director Jorge Mester will conduct the symphony for the "Final Farewell to Touring" concert. A long-time friend of Schickele, Mester conducted the debut P.D.Q. Bach performance back when they were both students at

Geraghty and Stipe placing in the 200 yard breaststroke. Barry Stipe swam the fastest time for that event in Caltech's history, 2:01.41, just missing NCAA Nationals qualifying standards. Next came Monica Holboke breaking the record in the

Brian Shim finished off his college swimming career with a strong 2:30.79 in the breaststroke. Karen Ross set a lifetime best in the 100 freestyle, 1:00.65.

200 yard breaststroke with a

2:48.50.

The last event was the 400 yard Free Relay and the women's team needed each member to drop time off their best swim to set a record. Ross led off with a solid 1:01.82. Johnson swam second and dropped five seconds to post an outstanding 1:03.92. The third leg was Lee's and she swam a quick 1:05.71. Anchoring the team was Holboke who brought it home in a 1:01.81 to shave three seconds off the old mark for a 4:12.21.

The April Fool's Day program will feature many of P.D.O.'s most notorious works, including the "1712 Overture," a glorious sendup of Tchaikovsky's "1812 Overture." The piece was "discovered" by composer Schickele in time for the Boston Pops centennial in 1985. Even Juilliard classmate Philip Glass does not escape the composer's sense of outrage(ousness), as demonstrated by "Prelude to 'Einstein on the Fritz'."

Schickele won the Grammy award for Best Comedy Recording in 1990 with P.D.Q. Bach: 1712 Overture and Other Musical Assaults and again in 1991 for P.D.Q. Bach: Oedipus Tex and Other Choral Calamities. If a recording of the farewell concert is released this year, he might well achieve a hat trick in 1992.

The concert improper begins at 8 PM. A pre-concert lecture on the estimable importance of the works of P.D.Q. Bach, delivered by Dr. Mary Ann Bonino and Rich Capparela, begins on stage at 7 PM.

A few tickets still remained at press time for this ultimate performance. They are available at the Caltech Ticket Office (x4652), the Pasadena Civic Auditorium box office (818/449-7360), and at TICKETRON outlets. Ticket

prices range from \$18 to \$35. 0 0

What other cultural attractions are there for Spring Break, this side of Palm Springs? At the UCLA James A. Doolittle Theatre, Noel Coward's "The Vortex" continues through March 31. Starring Stephanie Beacham and Rupert Everett, evening performances are Tuesday through Saturday at 8 PM and matinees are Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday at 2 PM.

Among the many Southern Californians catching rays shirtless in last Saturday's sun was Caltech middle distance runner Ned most of his fellow worshippers, nowever, Bowden was basking for a tan while simultaneously running a 1500 meter race in the Caltech Invitational II Track Meet held here

"Hey I just felt like taking my shirt off, o.k.?" was the Nedsters reply to an inquiry by this reporter as to why he DQ'ed himself by running without a uniform top. In spite of this loss of points, the Tech men pulled out a victory over all

other teams in the meet. By invitational scoring, Caltech was victorious with 139.5 points. Next was Biola with 131.5, Whittier with 108, Cal Lutheran with

103, Christ College with 26, Masters College with 9, and Southern Cal College with 6 points. The meet was a non-SCIAC event, and so Caltech's conference "Sprinklerhead" Bowden. Unlike record was unaffected as a result. This also meant that unattached runners could compete in the meet if they chose, as non-scoring participants.

The meet started out with a bang, or rather a whistle, with the 10,000 meter event. Twenty-five laps and a world of hurt later, Techers Chris Campo and Mike Ida captured second place (36:10) and fourth place (40:09) respectively. As the race proceeded, stares from athletes warming up for later events and comments like. "they're insane" were common. Even jumper Jack Prater admitted, "You've gotta be a real man to run the 10k.

The steeplechase, arguably a much MUCH more exciting race to watch than the 10k, ensued soon after the enduranceheads had cleared the track. Aaron Matzner, running unattached, ran right on the tail of race leader Ed Yuh from Whittier for most of the 3000 meter hurdling and waterjumping event. Matzner's tactic suceeded in unnerving Yuh, who had to deal with the ominous sound of Aaron's footsteps for most of the race.

Those ominous footsteps carried Matzner past Yuh in the last lap, and on to a first place in a time of 9:52. Matzner, a 3-2 student transfer from Whitman College, decided to redshirt this year in favor of peaking next year. He may soon shatter the existing Caltech steeplechase record and will be the continued on page 2

The two exchanged places several times during the race but it was Engles, who appeared as though he might cough up a lung any minute, who staggered across the finish line in the fourth place spot. Kister ran an admirable race, finishing in 10:51, just 3 seconds behind Engles.

In the 1500 meter event, Ned Bowden was Tech's hope for points. That hope was dashed, however, when the freshman runner removed his shirt and recieved a DQ. Bowden's time was an impressive 4:17. Although he didn't score points for Tech, he did get a chance to begin development of a much needed tan.

Aaron Matzner, not satisfied with a stellar performance in the steeplechase, decided to also jump into the 800 meter race. Matzner, in spite of fatigue, was sixth across the finish line in a time of 2:04. Behind Matzner, a battle was ensuing between Caltech Assistant Professor John Doyle and Ned Bowden.







Pataya won this hands down, although Ruddock House's block voting scheme vaulted Senior Ko Saipetch into second place.




Best Place to Buy Condoms
