In April 2005, many Caltech students, mostly Frosh, boarded a plane for Boston, Massachusetts to pull pranks against MIT in "enemy territory" during their campus preview weekend and hopefully ignite a friendly pranking rivalry between the two schools. The Caltech pranksters successfully passed out about seven hundred T-shirts that read "MIT" in authentic college font on the front, but on the back "Because not everyone can go to Caltech" complete with a small palm tree, to the potential MIT students. They also left palm trees and a brief note explaining their identity as Caltech students at various social events and on top of the MIT dome. Later that weekend, an 8-foot by 3-foot blimp labeled C.I.T. in very large letters was launched with 75 orange Caltech balloons, more palm trees and a banner that covered up the engraving of MASSACHUSETTS with a banner reading THAT OTHER, so that the building read That Other Institute of Technology. Once it was dark, a predesigned laser was turned on to display C-A-L-T-E-C-H, one letter at a time on the top of the Green Building, the tallest building on campus, and it took the MIT Hackers 30 minutes to locate the slick pranksters. The longchain of Caltech pranks was perfectly executed and the scoreboard of successful pranks, found on the Caltech vs. MIT website, is currently Caltech-6 to MIT-1.

The Caltech Bands, directed by Bill Bing (at Caltech now over thirty years!) played some great music to large and appreciative crowds again this year. Seems like they just keep getting better and better. For example, the Concert Band's performance of Johan de Meij's "Lord of the Rings" in Thorne Hall at Occidental College, was truly outstanding. Bob Feller, who conducts at Disneyland, was full of energy and great ideas when he conducted the concert band. Jay Cohen, who plays at the local race track, was great fun to work with as he displayed both his music and "magical" talents with the group. And the winner of this year's Caltech Composition for Band, Paul Fraser, flew in from Minnosota to conduct his winning compositon, "Chimera", which blended both jazz and funk with traditional classical elements. The band finished up the year with a very exciting performance of "Carmina Burana" as arranged for concert band.

The jazz bands were consistently fine with performances at the jazz festival and their indoor performances in Beckman Auditorium. Most inspiring was Nolan Shaheed's jazz quintet, with the outstanding Zane Musa on alto sax. Greg Bissonette, one of the great drummers on the scene today, came to Caltech and gave a drum clinic and was a guest soloist with the jazz bands on their January concert. Also working with the Caltech Jazz Bands was composer Joe Curiale, who was a regular writer for the "Tonight Show" band.

The jazz bands also released their lastest CD, "Capitol Sessions", which was recorded at Capitol Studios, is now available at the Caltech Bookstore.

Finally, a friend of the Caltech Jazz Bands, Ron Blake, who came in and "jammed" with the band members last year, just started touring with the popular rock group "Green Day". So, in the last year or two, members or former members of "Count Basie", "Big Bad Voodoo Daddy", "Green Day", and "Santanas' Band" only to mention a few players, have come in and played with our Caltech musicians.


























CALTECH Y


VOLLEYBALL


The Caltech Women's Water Polo team finished its 2005 season with three matches at the SCIAC Championships. Despite losses to the University of Redlands (0-13), Whittier College (3-15) and Cal Lutheran University (1-14), the weekend, and indeed, the whole season, had many bright spots, including its graduating class of 2005. Senior Delia Davies capped off her Caltech career by collecting 18 blocks in matches against the University of Redlands, Whittier College and Cal Lutheran University. All three schools rank among the Top Ten in the country for the NCAA Division III. In her home finale the week before conference championships, Davies had an incredible 12 blocks in a narrow 6-10 loss to the University of La Verne. For the season, Davies finishes with 75 blocks in 10 conference matches, and 200 blocks for the season. Senior Beth Dorman scored two goals against Whittier, bringing her season total to a team-high 21. Dorman also finished second on the team in assists with 10, and fourth on the team in steals with 31. Senior Yuliya Gorlina played in more than 90% of the team's quarters. She finished the year fourth on the team in ejections drawn with 16. Senior Shannon Lewis played only sparingly this season, but continued to demonstrate the leadership that made her a key member of the Caltech Swim program. Despite finishing 1-24, the Caltech Men's Basketball season saw several players step up and demonstrate their ability to produce for the team. Junior Jordan Carlson, the team's leading scorer, finished his season strong, averaging 18.5 points and 9.5 rebounds for the week. Junior Team Captain Day added two steals on the week, bringing his total for the season to a team-high 47. It was the third consecutive year Ivy has led the team in that category. Three Freshmen were entrenched in the starting lineup by season's end. Freshman Bryan Hires finished the season second on the team in scoring (8.5 ppg) and rebounding (4.6 rpg). He led the team in field goal percentage (48.1%), total assists (34) and total blocks (24). Forward Freshmen Nick Goeden and Guard Paxon Frady stabilized the frontcourt and backcourt positions, respectively. The team said goodbye to three graduating seniors during its home finale. All three studentathletes have been members of the Men's Basketball program throughout their four years at Caltech. Senior Team Captain Jeff Lamb missed most of this season with injuries, but he returned briefly for Thursday's Cal Lutheran game, checking in and playing one minute before returning to the bench to the applause of fans and teammates. He finishes his career having played 67 games, with 26 starts. Senior Christian Guitierrez led the team in three-point shooting this past season making 36.2% of his shots. He made 44 three-pointers over the course of his career at Caltech. For four years, Senior Xiao Wang has inspired his coaches and teammates with his drive to improve his game through dedication and hard work.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL ATHLETICS



The Women's Basketball team, led by a trio of Freshmen, took huge steps forward towards becoming a competitive program this season. Freshmen Jessica Roberts, Lindsay King and Rene Davis each ranked 1-2-3 on the team in scoring. That boost helped the team's overall scoring improve a whopping 126 percent over last season's average, and the team's field goal shooting improved by 43 percent. With players attacking the basket more aggressively, free-throw attempts were up 60 percent. And just a third of the way into the season, the team had nearly tripled the total number of three-point field goals made for all of last year. The team improved on defense as well. Opponents field goal shooting fell 14 percent, and overall opponent scoring fell nine percent. Steals were up 56 percent with King and Davis accounting for 55 percent of the team's total. The team was recording more than five times the number of blocks they were averaging over last year, lead by King's average on one block per game. The team's ball-handling improved, with turnovers down 31 percent, and assists per game have more than tripled. The team made great strides over this past season, and with new recruits coming for next year, it will be interesting to see how much they can continue to improve.

The Caltech Swimming & Diving team finished up a record setting season at the SCIAC Championships. Freshman Tim Curran broke the school's record in the 100 Yard Backstroke with a time of 52.74; beating the old record of 54.97 by more than 1.5 seconds and making a "B" qualifying standard for the NCAA Championships. Two days later, Curran also broke the 100 Yard Freestyle record with a time of 47.61. The previous record had been 47.93. The 400 Yard Medley Relay record of 3:46.9 had stood at Caltech since 1969. On Thursday, a team including Curran, Senior Team Captain Jason Lee and Sophomores Tom Jurczak and Dan Oliver obliterated it by more than seven seconds with a time of 3:39.96. Each member of the relay team dropped nearly two seconds apiece in accomplishing the feat. The record had been the only one not set during Head Coach Clinton Dodd's tenure at Caltech. The same team broke the 200 Yard Medley Relay record on Friday, with a time of 1:40.23. The old record of 1:42.07 had stood since 1989.On the women's side, Junior Bekah Eason came in third overall in the 3-meter diving competition with a score of 343.10. Eason also placed fourth in the 1-meter diving competition with a score of 303.30.

42. Any good Techer knows that this number is the Answer to Life, the Universe, and Everything. But they all wonder, "What is the question?" On April 16 and 18, 2005, 15 men, fine athletes and seekers of truth all, resolved this quandary at long last. The question is of course, "How many points did the Caltech Men's Track and Field Team score at SCIAC Conference Championships this year?" With this total, which earned them sixth place, the 2005 men proved they were 180% better than the men of 2004. Conservative extrapolations use this growth to predict that in 2008 the team will earn 921.984 points, thereby taking every single one of the 589 available points, plus 332.984 extra for good measure. By 2226, the team's point tally will experience an overflow error. Until then, it appears a new era of Caltech domination looms. The Beavers were led by Jeremy Leibs, who won a long-coveted SCIAC championship in the 110m hurdles and took sixth in the 100m, but if you think Leibs was tough on his competitors, you should see what he did to the hurdles! Arguably the most impressive performance of the year came from Pat Boyle, who came up just short of the school 400m record with a blazing 48.68, good for second in one of the conference's toughest events. Boyle also took fifth in the 200m. The 4x400m relay team of Tim Tirrell, Team Captain Stuart Ward, Matt Kiesz, and Boyle also shined, their fiery-orange heads nearly bursting into flame from atmospheric friction as they passed the baton around in 3:21.00, surprisingly challenging perennial SCIAC power CMS before taking second place. Other notable performances included the 4x100m relay team of Tirrell, Ward, Boyle, and Leibs taking third, Jordan Carlson's gravity- defying fourth place in the high jump, and Tirrell's impressive sixth in the 200m. The distance squad was anchored by Team Captain Gustavo Olm (steeple/5K), Mark Eichenlaub (1500m), and Kiesz (800m/1500m). Big strides were also made by Kevin Dick. At 6'2", they were some very big strides indeed. David Rosen battled injury all season but represented Caltech well in the 1500m. Ransom Poythress (javelin), Tom Jurczak (javelin), and Alex Sheive (shot, discus) formed the Beavers' studly throw squad. Dima Kernasovskiy (long jump, 100m, 200m), Mike Inodomi (lj, 100m), Chris Gonzales (lj, 100m, 200m), and Ryan Samson(lj, 100m, 200m) all showed vast improvement in the sprints and jumps. Thanks to our coaches Julie, Scott, Ian, Melissa, and Sarah for a great year.






WOMEN'S TENNIS
