## Frosh














From Summertime SURFing By SURF Director, Carolyn Merkel

For twenty years SURF, Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship, students have had the opportunity to conduct independent research projects under the guidance of leading scientists and technical researchers here at Caltech or at JPL. The essence of SURF is the tutorial relationship between student and mentor. SURF introduces students to the life of the scientist and helps to idenitfy and encourage research creativity.







SURF imitates the grant-seeking process. In collaboration with their mentors, students write proposals for their projects. A faculty committee reviews the proposals and awards are made on the basis of reviewer recommendation and available funding. At the conclusion, the students submit a technical paper and give an oral presentation on SURF Seminar Day.

Through SURF, students experience the process of research as a creative intellectual activity and gain a more realistic view of the opprotunities and demands of a professional research career.

The Caltech Division of Geological and Planetary Sciences (GPS) encompasses the fields of geology, geochemistry, geophysics, geobiology and planetary sciences. Located in Arms, North Mudd, and South Mudd buildings on the southwestern corner of campus, on campus resources included the GPS library and Shock Wave Laboratory. Nearby is the United States Geologic Survey office.

The location gives the Seismology Laboratory plenty to study — Southern California is frequently active, with minor, unnoticable earthquakes daily, and larger ones less frequently. Location, of course, provides an incentive to work.

Other areas of reseach in the department include: glaciology, shock wave research, land remote monitoring, experimental petrology, mineralogical research, the paleomagnetics lab, the Hawaii Scientific Drilling Project, Global Information Systems and Remote Sensing, geodynamics, planetary astronomy and study of the Mars Surface, aided by data from Mars Pathfinder.

The geology department has also had success with its new course, Ge1, one of the two menu courses recently introduced into the mandatory Caltech Core Curriculum. Students were introduced to basic concepts in the lecture hall and in the field.



The Chemistry Department at Caltech has a long history of excellence in education and research. Annual ponding of Professor Nate "Fozzie" Lewis in Millikan Pond by his Chem1a students on his birthday (luckily enough in the middle of the first term) has become a tradition. Although Caltech has long had a reputation for excellence in chemistry in the areas of molecular structure and chemical bonding, the focus of Chemistry has been shifting both toward materials chemistry and to links between biological sciences and chemistry. Professor Lewis has met some success in his work developing an electronic "nose:" a device which distinguishes objects by their odor. Starting off with only the Gates and Crellin Laboratories in 1953, the Chemistry department soon expanded to Church, Noyes, and Braun Laboratories. The completion of Beckman Institute in 1989 increased laboratory and office space and provided state of the art science facilities for the growing department. The prestige of the department was evident when Dr. Linus Pauling was awarded the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 1954 and the Peace Prize in 1962, and furthered when Dr. Rudy Marcus became a Nobel Laureate in 1992.

The Biology Department at Caltech has experienced rapid growth in just a few decades. Back in 1951, all of Biology was housed in Kerckhoff Laboratory and a cluster of small plant laboratories on the north side of San Pasqual. Back then, all science majors at Caltech were required to take Bi1. The importance of DNA was just beginning to be appreciated, and the function of RNA was unknown. Since then, Biology has expanded to include research conducted in not only Kerckhoff, but also Alles, the Beckman Institute, Beckman Behavioral Biology, Braun and Church laboratories. Bi1 has returned; now all students must take it to graduate. Requirements involving biochemistry, genetics, and neurobiology insure that biology majors are well prepared in their field when they graduate from Caltech. Many undergraduates have the opportunity to take Bi22, which allows them to receive research units for doing research with a professor of their choice. One of the most significant events has been the increasing emphasis on neuroscience, which now represents about half the effort of the division. In addition, Dr. Ed Lewis was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1995, contributing to the excellence of the department.


The Harry G. Steele Laboratory of Electrical Sciences was built in 1965. Upon completion of the Gordon and Betty Moore Laboratory of Engineering in 1996, most of the EE department relocated there.

Royal Wasson Sorenson (1882-1965) was the first EE professor at Caltech. He was invited to start the department in 1910, while he was working at General Electric, Co.

Sorenson did not think his family would enjoy living in California, but the idea of creating a department was very tempting. So he planned to stay only five years. He never left. He did groundbreaking works in power vacuum switches. His advice to students? "Hitch your ambitions to the ideas of good men."


This was the last year for club librarian Mark Neidengard and club president Peter Oakley, who have done a tremendous amount for the club across the board.

The Caltech Anime Society had a quite enjoyable year and hopes too see many old and new faces next year.







# Behold! The Student




Publishing out of the goodness of our hearts, for the benefit of all....










# ECPHONEMA

The Caltech Women's Volleyball Team had their best season ever with an 11-9 winning record. The team was coached by Head Coach Maureen Burl and Assistant Coach Mike Burl. The '97 season brought 22 women out for the team, allowing Caltech to have both a varsity and junior varsity squad for the first time in Caltech volleyball history.


The JV team was captained by juniors Kara Swedlow and Jian Ye. The squad played well in three tough matches, but ended up 0-3. At the end of the season they played an exciting intersquad match which demonstrated the improvement of all the players. Natsuko Kagawa was voted Most Valuable Player by her teammates, while Ewa Matjeska was voted Most Improved.

The varsity squad won 11 matches and the alumni match. They beat the rival team La Sierra twice, to whom they had lost in previous seasons. They took one game from each of the SCIAC teams, Whittier and Occidental. In the last match of the season, Caltech took on the very strong Pacific Christian team and went to five games, with Caltech losing the 5th game 14-16.

The ladies played very well all season and had the skills to play a three-person serve reception. Freshmen Dominika Rytwinska and Jennifer Fong played at the outside hitter position and were the two primary serve reception passers. Our excellent setters, Grace Yang and Erika Swanson, split time as serve reception allowed the team to have the toughest offense in Caltech's history of women's volleyball. Starting middles, Alexis Johnson and Diana King, put up a fearsome block. Strong hitting came from all the players, and our setters and middles even connected for some quick hits in the middle.

Senior Grace Yang and sophomore Erika Swanson led the team as co-captains. Grace was voted Most Valuable Player by her teammates, Diana King was voted Most Improved and Jennifer Fong was voted Most Inspirational. There were seven school records set this season, with Grace Yang setting six of them! Yang set the following records: Most Service Points in a season (224), Most Ace Serves in a season (60), Most Assists in a career (788), Most Digs in a career (488), Most Service Points in a career (565), and Most Ace Serves in a career (150). Alexis Johnson set the record for Most Blocks in a career (48). The team looks forward to another exciting season next year.



I don't know what it takes to stop Andreas. Fortunately, neither do our opponents."

Andreas is not only an incredibly talented athlete, but a patient and skilled teacher as well. Many, if not all, of the team members would credit him with making the team what they are today.





### Women's Tennis

It was quite a year for Caltech women's tennis. We finished the season with ten players, six of whom made their collegiate tennis debut. The season had its close matches and heartbreaks; Tech played six 5-4 matches, losing the majority but pulling out two key 5-4 wins during the conference tournament. The Beaver squad entered the SCIAC tournament in 6th place after close losses to the 4th and 5th place teams during dual match play. Caltech played well, defeating Cal Lu and Oxy 5-4 to grab a 5th place tournament finish. The Beaver squad tied with Oxy for 5th place in the final SCIAC conference standing and earned a final West region ranking of #10. Senior Alexis Johnson, sophomore Audrey Lee, and frosh Susan Sher finished the season with the top singles records at 11-5, 11-6 and 10-4 at the #1, #4/#5, and #5/#6 positions, respectively.


